Survey #1: Gathering Whole-School interest in changing our College Uniform: In the last newsletter I flagged our intention to investigate whether there is sufficient interest amongst students and their families to change our current uniform offerings and - if there is - shortly thereafter call for expressions of interest for student, parent/guardian/carer, and teacher representatives on a "Uniform Working Party." - Survey #2: Support for Primary School families (Transport/Supervision) to Dunmunkle Athletics in Marnoo (01.06.23): Yesterday afternoon families of our primary students were sent a link to a very quick survey to determine if our F-6 families need assistance with transport and/or supervision of their child/ren on the day of the Dunmunkle Athletics Day on Friday 01.06.23 (all day). Providing this assistance recognises the increasingly complex dynamic of family/work responsibilities that our families are navigating in today's challenging economic context. - Survey #3: Potential New Wellbeing Resource to support Parents/Guardians/Carer: In the last newsletter I advised we are considering investing in Dr Michael Carr-Gregg's "SchoolTV" Wellbeing website as a parenting resource to help our families hold conversations with their child/ren on topics including: cybersafety, managing screen time, online gaming, mental health, youth anxiety, healthy bodies, exam jitters, surviving the final year of high school (plus more). Results will be reported back to our College community in our first June newsletter; including whether we will go ahead with the purchase of this resource to support our families.
- Survey #4: Students Attitude to School Survey (AtoSS) Like all other government schools, Murtoa College values listening to our students (student voice) as a means to improve student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction. The AtoSS is an annual student survey designed by the Department to assist schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school whereby the survey gathers the thoughts and feelings of our students in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general. This year, students at Murtoa College will complete the AtoSS survey in Week 5 of Term 2. The following is a synopsis of information the Department provides for parents/guardians/carers to help them better understand the AtoSS:
 - What are the benefits of AtoSS? Young people enjoy having a say! This survey has been running for nearly 20 years
 and is invaluable in helping schools understand student views to plan programs and activities to improve your
 child's schooling experience. The survey responses also help the Department of Education understand how
 student's learning experiences can be improved.
 - O What are the risks of AtoSS? While we do not anticipate many risks of participation, some students may find some of the survey questions personal and sensitive in nature. Should you agree for your child to participate, they are still free to skip questions or to withdraw at any stage if the survey makes them upset or uncomfortable. A teacher will be present during the survey to support students. The questions are selected from validated survey instruments used in Australia and around the world, are strength-based, and tailored for each year level group.
 - What will my child be asked to do in the AtoSS? Your child will be invited to complete the survey online during class time using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Please note: Student participation in the survey is voluntary and students may withdraw at any time; with the survey taking around 20-45 minutes to complete.
 - O How is my child's confidentiality protected? Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey from their teacher. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. Personally identifiable data will not be recorded in the survey response file to ensure the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.
 - How will results be reported? The survey results will be reported back to the school in aggregate form throughout
 the survey period. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no
 individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per
 year level. Your school may share the results of the survey with parents, in documents such as the School Annual
 Report.
 - Options for participation: Participation in this survey is **voluntary**. If you **do not** wish for your child to do the survey, please opt out via email to bec.carter@education.vic.gov.au, please do so bec.carter@education.vic.gov.au, please do so before 9.00 am Monday May 22, stating that you wish to opt out of your child's participation, along with your child/ren's name and year level. NOTE: If we do not receive a Refusal of Consent email from yourself before the survey commencement date mentioned within this letter, it means that you give your consent for your child to participate in the 2023 Attitudes to School Survey.

Congratulations to Jaxon, Levi, Braxton, Posie, Charlie K, and Judith for reading 50 nights and receiving their bag tags.




